

## Poverty Focused ODA: Methodological Note

The determination of the degree to which Canadian ODA is focused directly on poverty is based on the following codes, with amounts of disbursements derived from Global Affairs Canada's [Historical Projects Database](#) and the annual [Statistical Review](#).

It should be noted that this collection of DAC sector codes is a proxy indicator, which suggests trends but should not be interpreted as an absolute value for poverty related ODA disbursements.

### Poverty-Related OECD DAC Sector Codes:

- Basic education -11220, 11230, 11240, plus half of 1110, 11120, 11130 and 11182
- Basic health – 12220, 12230, 12240, 12250, 12261, 12262, 12263
- Reproductive health and HIV/AIDS – 13020, 13030, 13040, 13081, 18064
- Water and Sanitation – 14010, 14015, 14021, 14022, 14031, 14032, 14040, 14050, 14081
- Civil Society and human rights – 15150, 15160
- Informal finance, SMEs – 24040, 32130, 32140
- Agriculture – 31110, 31120, 31130, 31140, 31150, 31161, 31162, 31163, 31164, 31166, 31181, 31182, 31191, 31192, 31193, 31194, 31195, 43040
- Vocational Training – 11330
- Non-humanitarian food aid/food security – 52010

The percentage of poverty focused ODA is a share of “long-term development sector-allocated ODA”. The latter is calculated from Global Affairs Canada database sector codes.

### Long-term development sector-allocated ODA:

Total International Assistance less the following codes:

- Operations and management
- Promotion of development awareness – 99820
- Sector unspecified – 99810
- Support for refugees in donor countries – 99810
- Transfer to executing agencies for administrative costs – 931010
- Humanitarian assistance – 72010, 72040, 72050, 73010, 74010
- Debt forgiveness – 60010, 60020, 60030
- Imports support – 53030
